Seniors—if you had a 2.8 weighted GPA at the end of your junior year and meet minimum course requirements, you're already in! Not a senior just yet? You could be eligible for this program next year!

NC College Connect is a program that matches North Carolina public high school seniors with select UNC System universities, North Carolina Independent Colleges and Universities, and their local North Carolina community college where they already meet admissions requirements.

If you've been admitted to college through NC College Connect, here's what you need to know:

- To see what institutions you've been admitted to and accept your admission, scan the QR code on your letter (or the one below!) to visit NCCollegeConnect.org.
- There you will find an "Accept My Admission" button that will take you to the NC College Connect portal if you are already logged into your CFNC account.
- 3. After logging in or creating a CFNC account, you will see a list of colleges and universities where you've been admitted. You'll just need to complete a short form to accept your admission at the institutions of your choice. You'll see formal acceptance letters in your portal as well.
- 4. For your local community college, the program will redirect to that institution's traditional application—but don't worry, you already meet application requirements and are already admitted! The application is quick and easy.
- 5. You only need to apply once—through NC College Connect—to reach participating institutions, with no need to complete separate applications through their traditional processes.
