Class content

The focus of the EL- Literature & Composition Class is to build up literacy and writing skills in English so that students can become independent readers and problem solvers by developing academic language, computer skills, and writing as researchers. The text material is related to the English class material so that students can build more academic concepts and background knowledge required to be successful in EOCs or other classes. The objective is to develop reading comprehension of compelling and complex texts so that in the future students can pursue higher education either in 2-year or 4-year college programs, or in a work environment. Students are expected to realize that reading is key to success.

Class Rules

- 1) Enter the classroom in silence and prepare your material to learn.
- 2) Follow the rules described in the Student Handbook
- 3) Respect yourself and others as well as respect the school property and materials.
- 4) Avoid using profanity.

Late Work Policy

Make Up time

For students to obtain a passing grade for each quarter, they need to make up their excused or unexcused absences after school.

30 minutes per missing class period.

NO COMPLIANCE = F (59%)

Make-up work Policy
