## Overview

AP Statistics is the equivalent of a college level introductory course. As such, it will be rigorous and demanding. Students enrolled in this course should be capable of working at the college level and willing to work at the college level. It should be a challenging yet rewarding and beneficial experience. All students will take the AP Statistics Exam on Thursday, May 08, 2024.

Grading will be based on homework, quizzes, tests, and projects. Students not submitting assigned work will receive a course grade of Incomplete which will be removed once the work is submitted. All grades will be published in Power School promptly for your information.

## Requirements and Procedures

1. Required materials that should be brought to class every day.
  - Accordion Style Folder if Possible instead of 3-ring binder
  - Chromebook
  - Pencils
  - Calculators will be provided in class only. (TI-84)
2. Homework will be assigned on a nightly basis. It is important that homework be completed to the best of the student's ability each day and completed on time.
3. Missed tests and work due to absences must be made up in a timely manner. (Maximum 3 days for full credit.)
  - Tests must be made up before/after school.
  - It is the ultimate responsibility of the student to make up work missed due to an absence.
4. Students who need extra help on any material are strongly encouraged to attend the learning hub. The scheduled learning hub time will be on Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 4:30 pm to 6:00 pm. There is some flexibility with advanced notice.
