

CALIFORNIA WILDFIRES DEADLIEST AND MOST DESTRUCTIVE ON RECORD

From mid-July to August 2018, wildfires began erupting across California, mostly across the northern part of the state. This wildfire season is the most destructive on record in California's history. There are a total of 7,579 fires burning throughout the dry landscape. In November, a new batch of wildfires erupted, the most deadly ones being the Woolsey Fire and the Camp Fire. The Camp Fire has already become California's deadliest and most destructive fire on record. It has been resposible for 83 deaths and the destruction of over 10,000 structures.

California has a susceptibility to wildfires. This year they had an all time high of dead trees, increasing the amount of dead tree fuel that spreads wildfires. Global warming is also to blame. Due to global warming, California has seen less rain and higher temperatures, creating a dry landscape that allows fires to burn more frequently and stronger. Thankfully, the most dangerous fire, the Camp Fire, is now 95% contained. The Camp Fire is centered around a town called Paradise, just northeast of San Fransisco. However, even after these deadly fires are contained ,risks still remain. Areas affected by wildfires are more susceptible to flooding because they lack the vegetation that would absorb the water. This lack of vegetation can cause flooding with even just moderate amounts of rain. Rainfall began on Wednesday and has continued since then, the state's fist significant downpour in six months. Hundreds of people and dogs are searching through what's left of Paradise in hopes of finding those still missing. As of Friday, 11/23/2018, the death toll has risen to 83 and there are 563 missing.

Ragsdale has a variety of winter sports to offer which are just now bustling to life as football season comes to a close.
