### **More Grading Info**

- Missing CW/HW assignments will be marked as '0' in the gradebook. If you were absent, you may show me the work when you return or submit it on Canvas.
- You must show work on every assignment (unless there is obviously no work required). NO work = no credit. No exceptions. I may randomly ask for your work, so have it on hand.
- To promote teamwork, there may be times when assignments can be done with partners.
- During tests or non-partner quizzes: If you are seen talking, motioning to, or otherwise communicating with any other student, then you will receive a zero on the assignment.
- No Cellphones allowed during tests or quizzes.
- Any test grade for a unit that is higher than the unit's quiz grade will replace low quiz grades for that unit. If you miss a quiz then it will not be necessary to make it up. The test grade will be used instead.

### Turning in work

- Work may be requested to be submitted through Canvas or in hand. There are some programs that we will use
  that don't require a paper submission, such as Desmos or Delta Math. There will be times when all you need to do
  is acknowledge that you've completed an assignment and I will check in the appropriate locations if it's on an
  application outside of Canvas.
- When turning in hard copies of work:
  - o Place ALL completed work (makeup or otherwise) into your class block's tray.
  - Label everything you submit with your: 1) (preferred) First and Last name 2) Date 3) Block

### Makeup Work

- Check for missed work on Canvas. If a hard copy is available, you may ask for it upon your return to class. I am going to try my best to post the assignments in case you need to access them while away from class.
- Complete the assignments within 3 days of the absence in order to receive full credit.
- Arrangements must be made to take a missed test.
- Turn in all makeup work to your class block's tray.
