HONORS PROGRAMS

Honors courses go into greater depth and have a more rigorous curriculum. Students are recommended by teachers for Honors and Advanced Placement (AP) courses, but Northern Guilford has an open enrollment policy. AP courses are weighted on a 5-point scale, Honors courses on a 4.5point scale, and all other courses on a 4-point scale. Some courses are not offered every year since offerings require a minimum enrollment. In addition, online courses are available from the North Carolina Virtual Public High School / Apex Virtual Learning System.

CREDIT AND GRADUATION INFORMATION

Northern Guilford follows a traditional, six-period schedule. Periods are 55 minutes in length and all classes meet daily for an entire year. Multiple credits are awarded for classes meeting for more than one period daily. Credit is granted at the end of the course and is based on the final course grade. To receive a College/University Preparatory Diploma, 2019 graduates must complete 22 Carnegie units; this includes 4 units of English, 4 of social studies, 3 of science (all science courses have a lab component), 4 of math, 2 of a world language, and 1 of physical education/health.

GPA AND RANK IN CLASS

On the transcript, Northern Guilford High School provides grade point average (weighted and un-weighted) and numerical class rank. Weighted GPA is determined using the following method: a 4-point scale for regular courses, a 4.5-point scale for Honors courses, and a 5-point scale for AP courses. In computing GPA, all students and all courses are included. Class rank is based on weighted GPA.
