
☆WELCOME BACK FROM SPRING BREAK!

*New students: continue to check your roster weekly on PS to see if any new students have enrolled at your school(even if they are transferring from another GCS school). If you have new students, check their scores and/or administer the Screener Test as needed and update their PNCFs, upload the ROA to your school's data folder and let Beth and Doreen know.

*Classroom physical environment: make sure your classroom has a 3Ls Wall displaying the EQ/FQ, standards, Word Play, Juicy Sentences, Linguistic Frames, etc. For ideas, please <u>look at</u> the pictures of

3Ls classrooms we have collected over the years.

*Juicy Sentence Play: should be done interactively by using sentence strips/ adding machine tape., etc. Students should tear the sentences up and "play with" (manipulate) the different sentence chunks.

*Student Portfolios :please continue to collect dated, student work samples each quarter to show students' growth over time.


