

FREE MENTAL HEALTH THERAPY SERVICES BY UNCG PSYCHOLOGY CLINIC

The UNCG Psychology Clinic is able to provide therapy services to GCS students who are experiencing mental health challenges, such as depression, anxiety, trauma, anger, family adjustment difficulties. There is no cost to families for these services, or interpreter or transportation services as needed. Referrals may be



made by school counselors or school social workers, using this referral form. Upon receipt of the referral form, UNCG Psychology Clinic will send consent forms to the referring staff member that parents/guardians will need to sign to be returned to UNCG.

The attached referral forms will be faxed to a secure number to Dr. Gray, Director of the UNCG clinic. Once UNCG receives the signed consent forms, the UNCG Psychology Clinic will contact the family directly to arrange for services.
