



## 2024-25 CLASS REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

February 19, 2024

Hello Freshman, Sophomore, and Junior Students and Families,

The next school year's class register is here for the Middle College at UNCG! The resources and information below will help guide decisions about your child's course requests and help them reach the next stage of academic progress.

Registration will begin after Spring Break on Monday, March 11th. A link to the online version of the registration book can be access by clicking <https://www.gcsnc.com/Page/28797>. The registration book contains information about the multitude of choices in GCS and is designed to help you and your child make the best choices for middle/high school education and post-secondary opportunities.

1. Refer to the **4-year Course Guideline Plan** to see what high school classes your student needs for the entire year and recommended college courses for the Fall semester.
2. For college classes, use this link to view Fall 2024 class availability:

3. Once your student has decided on their classes, use this link, <https://bit.ly/mcuncgclassreg>, to complete the class requests.

Your child will register for course requests using the Online Course Registration. The student online registration window will open from March 1 to 10, 2024. Parents/guardians may review their child's 2024-25 course requests by accessing the PowerSchool Parent Portal. You may find the parent portal on our school's webpage by clicking the tab for Parents - INSERT THE TITLE ON YOUR WEBPAGE - Class Registration.

Students will receive a copy of their course requests for the 2024-25 school year. Please take time to review and discuss your child's course selections. We encourage students to take advantage of rigorous coursework as GCS is proud to offer courses and programs that will prepare students for educational and career opportunities after high school.

Remember, only Seniors can have college classes in-person during our lunch hour, starting at 11:00 a.m. It is highly suggested to take in-person classes unless there is an extenuating circumstance as to why in-person classes will not work.

Also, students cannot take high school classes online or at the college level if they are offered within the Middle College. Note, Juniors' schedules take priority due to graduation requirements, then Sophomores, and then Freshmen.

*Taking college classes is contingent upon your students' current semester high school and college class grades.*

Students should have an idea of the classes they want to take next school year in preparation for their individual registration meeting with Mrs. Monroe starting March 18th.
