Encouraged	3	Provide examples of how it actively engages with the engineering community.




















ExploreWorks Job Shadowing







How to Prepare

- Deadlines. Most programs have deadlines January through April
- VERIFY any deadlines yourself; we copied deadlines as a convenience for you!
- Remember recommendations and transcript requests. Applications may ask for these. Ask early!
- Tell your story. Don't be shy. Make sure you write a complete essay and not a few sentences.

The UNCF STEM Scholars Program is an initiative designed to identify and provide scholarship and academic support for African American, Hispanic American, Asian Pacific Islander American, American Indian and Alaskan Native high school students who aspire to earn STEM degrees and to pursue careers in STEM fields. The program awards 100 scholarships on an annual basis.

The application is open for high school seniors who are entering college as first-time freshmen in fall 2025.

PROGRAM BENEFITS:

Tiered tuition scholarship with funding up to \$25,000:

- Up to \$2,500 per academic year for freshmen and sophomores, \$5,000 for juniors and seniors, and an additional \$5,000 for students whose academic programs require a fifth year.
- Scholarships are renewable for five undergraduate years, contingent upon:
 - Maintenance of a 3.0 (out of 4.0) GPA + continued full-time enrollment to a degree in an eligible STEM major
- A \$5,000 stipend based on a STEM-related project/internship of the student's interest
- Academic support and mentoring
- Access to online academic support services and resource platform, as well as other STEM-discipline support services

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

To qualify, applicants must:

- Be African American, Hispanic American, Asian Pacific Islander American, American Indian/ Alaskan Native
- Be a citizen, legal permanent resident, or national of the United States
- Have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 on an unweighted 4.0 scale
- Pursued a rigorous course of study in high school in math and science courses, including pre-calculus
- Have demonstrated financial and unmet need as measured by the student's college or university
- Arrange for a letter of recommendation to be submitted via the UNCF application portal

Complete and submit the application by the deadline of Monday, March 24, 2025, 5pm EST/2pm PST
