- 2. Have a minimum 2.5 grade point average (B-/C+).
- 3. Expected to be enrolled as a full-time undergraduate student in an accredited college or university (two-four-year program).
- 4. All majors are accepted, but preference is given to Criminal Justice or a related field.
- 5. Submit an original essay on the topic listed in the application.
- 6. Students must be active in the community, church, and/or school activities.
- 7. Applicants must submit their most current NC Public High School Standardized transcript, including GPA.
- 8. Students enrolled in a 2-year or 4-year institution as an Early or middle college student are eligible.
