Finalists for these scholarships are selected from all students who apply to the Honors Program by the priority deadline, with decisions based on, but not limited to, completed application, exceptional academic ability, leadership, community involvement, interviews and letters of recommendation. The University Honors Program application will grant consideration for each program and depending upon the criteria met, applicants will be placed into a review for one or all scholarships.

CHEATHAM-WHITE SCHOLARS PROGRAM

The Cheatham-White Scholars Program draws some of America's most high-achieving seniors ready to spread their wings on a campus widely known for its national leadership in science, technology, mathematics and engineering disciplines, as well as liberal arts and business studies, and recognized as the country's largest historically Black university.

Award

Each recipient will be awarded a fully-funded four-year scholarship that covers the costs of all of the following: tuition, student fees, housing, meals, textbooks, a laptop computer, supplies, travel and personal expenses. Each scholarship also provides four summers of fully funded enrichment and networking opportunities that may include international travel and study.

Criteria

- Apply for admissions as a first-year freshman for the fall semester in pursuit of a baccalaureate program at North Carolina A&T.
- Be a United States citizen or permanent resident.
- Be on course to graduate from high school in the spring semester prior to college admission.
- Minimum 4.0 or higher weighted cumulative GPA.
- Show exceptional qualities of character and leadership.
- Be significantly involved in extracurricular activities.
- Demonstrate a strong commitment to service.

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES FOR HONORS STUDENTS

DOWDY SCHOLARS ENRICHMENT PROGRAM

The Lewis and Elizabeth Dowdy Scholars Enrichment Program is a preeminent scholarship established in the Fall 2008 and awarded to entering freshman who have shown excellence in academics and scholarly leadership during their high school matriculation.

Award

This program awards a four-year renewable scholarship that covers tuition, fees, room, board, and books. Recipients are also supported through enrichment programming and may also use funds to travel abroad during the fall and spring semester.

Criteria

- Open to incoming freshmen pursuing their first bachelor's degree.
- Be on course to graduate from high school in the spring semester prior to college admission.
- Minimum 3.75 cumulative GPA (weighted).
- Must be a U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen.
- Must show exceptional characteristics of leadership and service.

FEBRUARY ONE SCHOLARS PROGRAM

This program will yield leaders that are empowered to grow and develop professionally while utilizing social consciousness to serve society.

Award

Candidates shall be selected on the basis of merit. Financial need shall not be a consideration. Each scholarship covers the following: tuition, student fees, housing, and meals.

Criteria

- Be a competitive applicant for admission as a freshman in the fall semester into a baccalaureate program at N.C. A&T.
- Be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident.
- Be on course to graduate from high school in the spring semester prior to college admission.
- Have a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.75 or higher on a 4.0 scale.
- Must pursue an undergraduate degree program within the College of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences, the College of Education, or the College of Health and Human Sciences.
- Embody the characteristics of the A&T Four through exceptional qualities of character and leadership, be significantly involved in extracurricular activities, and demonstrate a strong commitment to service.
