Salary

\$20,000-\$50,000 per year

Education/ Training

Phlebotomist must have a high school diploma or GED and obtain a certification. If you would like to become a phlebotomist, you should participate in a training program that will help you pass your exam. In this program you will learn important information like how to properly store and handle blood samples, the anatomy of the human body, safety precautions and how to properly perform blood collection.
