

Estimate of Time Spent on State Required Assessments (Elementary Schools)

At the elementary school level, the following assessments are required:

- Beginning-of-Grade 3 (BOG3) English Language Arts/Reading Assessment
- End-of-Grade Assessment for English Language Arts/Reading at Grades 3, 4, and 5
- End-of-Grade Assessment for Mathematics at Grades 3, 4, and 5
- End-of-Grade Assessment for Science at Grade 5

In Guilford County Schools, each school selects the administration date for all assessments. The administration date selected by the school must fall within the approved testing window and adhere to all procedural requirements outlined by the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction (NCDPI).

For the Beginning-of-Grade 3 and End-of-Grade Assessments:

The chart below details the estimated time for each assessment, which is the time that the NCDPI estimates it will take nearly all students to complete the assessment. The NCDPI does allow ALL students some time beyond the estimated time. However, the BOG3 and EOG assessments each have a maximum time allowed.

It should be noted, that this document does not address the amount of time required to administer any district mandated assessments.
