# **APPLYING FOR A HIGH SCHOOL OPTION: TIPS AND BEST PRACTICES**

- Carefully review the application requirements for the schools to which you are applying. Students may apply to up to five programs and must indicate rank-order preference.
- If you are asked to provide recommendations, ask the appropriate adults ahead of time if they would be willing to submit a positive recommendation for you and gather their name and email address. Make sure you give the teachers plenty of notice so that they can submit the recommendation well before the application deadline of March 4, 2020, at 5 p.m.
- Some schools request recent report cards or final report cards from the previous year and EOG/EOC test scores. If you are a current GCS student, these will be provided for you. If you are not a current GCS student, these will need to be submitted through the application portal electronically in PDF or JPG format. You can use your phone to upload a photo of the document.
- Some applications have short-answer questions or essays. Consider writing your essay first in a Word document so that you can take your time and make revisions until you are satisfied with your response. Then you can copy/paste your response into the application.
- Make sure that you complete your applications well before the final submission deadline of March 4, 2020, at 5 p.m.
