- We have teachers from at least 13 different countries that share their cultures and customs to make us a unique place to love to learn.





 - Having a better memory
 - Boosting brain development




More reasons to be bilingual:



- ALL children turning five years old on or before August 31st can attend kindergarten in Guilford County Schools next school year!
- Kindergarten readiness refers to the skills a child brings to the school community when he or she enters kindergarten. Children demonstrate skills across five areas of development.

Registering Your Student



The following information will help you prepare to register your child for kindergarten using the Schoolmint online registration system Your child must be five years old on or before August 31 to enroll.

All Guilford County Schools students must reside with a parent or court-appointed legal guardian who is a district resident.

Find your child's school assignment

Use our School Assignment Locator at schoolassignmentlocator.gcsnc.com or call the Stude Assignment Office at (336) 370-8303 if you need assistance finding your school assignment.

Cather required documents

Parents or court-appointed guardians must submit the following required documents in Schoolmint are provider. Collect this information before beginning the registration process to make sure you

- 2. North Carolina Health Assessment Transmittal Form certified by your child's health care
- 3. Immunizations (shots) records from your child's health care provide
- 4. Proof of residence showing name and address (CHOOSE ONE): All items below must be in the name of the parent(s) or court-appointed gu
