Grading Policy

Tests – 50% (1 retest is allowed per unit test, before or after school. Students will receive the average of the two scores.)

Quizzes – 10% (no retests – quizzes will be short & often unannounced)

Interactive Notebook – 30%

Assignments, homework, and notebook checks must be completed by the given due date. The grade will drop 1 letter grade for each day an assignment is late. Work that is turned in more than 3 days late will not be accepted, and students will receive a zero.

Interactive Notebook (INB)

We will use an Interactive Notebook to keep track of all the information we are learning, and the following materials will be needed:

- 1 composition notebook (100 sheets)
- Colored pencils
- Glue stick/tape
- Scissors
- Pencils
- Earbuds/headphones

This notebook will contain most assignments, notes, etc. and count as 30% of the final grade. We are essentially creating our own textbook/activity book!

Students must have decorated composition notebook by Friday, August 31.

Students must keep track of their notebooks at all times! It can be left on a shelf in the classroom when not needed for studying/HW.
