



AP classes are different--

AP classes have **college-level expectations** for students based on nationally-recognized curriculum standards;

The quantity and quality of work expected in in an AP course requires a **greater student commitment** of time, energy, and effort inside of and outside of the classroom;

AP courses, resources, teachers and curriculum are reviewed and approved by the College Board annually;

Students may earn college credit depending on AP exam performance.





# Career and College Promise Requirements



- 11 & 12 Grade only
- Tuition is waived
- Unweighted GPA
  2.8 or higher OR
  passing test scores
- Students must pick from an approved College Transfer or Career/Technical Pathway

# CCP STUDENT EXPECTATIONS & STANDARDS

Students are responsible for books and fees

Refunds – must withdraw before the 1<sup>st</sup> day of class CCP students are held to the same academic and discipline standards as traditional college students.

Attendance – no difference in excused & unexcused

Expect academic rigor! Be Self-Directed!

• Must maintain a GTCC cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher

Grades earned as CCP students go on your official college transcript o Falling below a cumulative GPA of 2.0, failing a course, and/or withdrawing from a course can result in probation and subsequent suspension from college classes

# **CCP** Application Process

#### The Application Packet includes:

- GTCC Application for Admission Apply online using the CFNC CCP application. (Please include your social security number.)
- High School Transcript –Please request this through cfnc.org.

# Don't forget to check off that you reviewed the following forms:

- Verification of Student Eligibility Form Please make sure that you have all signatures required and that you have included the pathway.
- Attendance Policy Form
- Consent to Release Form to be completed by the student.
- Media Release Form to be completed by the parent.

# TRANSCRIPT

- Send to GTCC
  - Public School Students use CFNC.org
    - o Sign in or create an account and click "Request a Transcript"
    - Select Guilford Technical Community College CCP as recipient
- Required each semester
- MUST list unweighted cumulative GPA
- MUST list courses by grade level
- MUST be signed and dated





# FEES AND BOOKS

- Tuition is always waived for CCP students
- Fees must be paid by the due date or classes may be dropped
- Students are responsible for books unless arrangements have been made with your school



# WHY THE BIG PUSH FOR THE ACT?

- Every junior in NC takes the ACT March 11<sup>th</sup> as part of each school's accountability measure and provides students with a free college entrance exam
- SE, along with every other NC high school, is evaluated on the percentage of students who earn a composite score of 19 or higher
- They took a practice ACT (PreACT) as sophomores.

# It's a chance to take a college admissions test and send scores to 4 schools for FREE!!!!!

# WHAT IS A "GOOD" SCORE ON THE ACT?

- Out of a maximum score of 36:
  - 16-21 score range for community college/tech schools/open enrollment
  - 18-24 range for traditional schools like UNCG, UNCA, ECU, etc.
  - 21-26 range for selective schools like UNCW, ASU, etc.
  - 30-35 range for highly elite schools like Harvard, Duke, Yale, UNC

Research the school you are interested in applying to determine the average ACT for admittance and set that score as your goal...that is your "good" score.  $\odot$ 

The "common data set" for each school is the best place to find this information.

# TESTING UPDATES

### **ACT/SAT**

o Most schools continue to be test-optional.

### University of North Carolina System

universities will not require SAT and ACT test scores on students' applications next year unless your weighted GPA is below 2.8.

## Minimum Admissions Requirements:


- 2.5 cum weighted GPA or 1010 combined SAT score/19 composite ACT score
- Each UNC system school has freedom to set its own requirements above these minimums

# PREPARING STUDENTS


- Every time students attend class, they are preparing for the ACT.
- Students take the PreACT test in November of their sophomore year as a benchmark for where they are and a predictor for ACT success. Scores were given to students in January.
- o Students receive ACT prep in every class at SE.
- Students should take additional practice tests to gauge their improvement

# **ACT WORKKEYS**

- A career readiness exam required for 12<sup>th</sup> graders who are CTE completers
- Testing occurs in November/December
- Many industries use this assessment to determine job readiness much like colleges use the ACT for college readiness
- Completion of a CTE pathway prepares students for success on this test
- o Scoring Silver or better is considered career ready



# WHAT IS SERVICE LEARNING?

Acts of service in the school and the community that helps students grow academically, personally and instill civic responsibility.

## How to get hours?

- Classes
  - Early Childhood Development, NJRTOC, Health Sciences, etc.
- o Clubs

# GRADE POINT AVERAGE (GPA)

- Your GPA Matters!
  - GAP Program: UW 2.8 GPA or higher
  - CCP/Dual Enrollment: UW 2.8 GPA or higher
  - 4-Year Colleges and Universities have minimum GPA requirements (UNC System = 2.5 or higher)
- Your GPA is calculated using your final grades:

# RECOMMENDATIONS

- Now is the time to start thinking about recommendations for scholarships, college applications, apprenticeships, etc.
  - Teachers, mentors
  - Counselors
  - Coaches
  - Pastors, church/youth leaders
  - Job or Community Service Supervisors
- It is vital to make sure you are building upon those positive relationships now so that you aren't scrambling in your senior year.

# NCAA ELIGIBILITY



College-bound student-athletes who want to practice, compete and receive athletically related financial aid during their first year at a Division I or II school need to meet the following requirements:

- Graduate from high school.
- Complete a minimum of 16 core courses for Division I or II.
- Earn a minimum required grade-point average in core courses.
- Earn a qualifying test score on either the ACT or SAT.
- Request final amateurism certification from the NCAA Eligibility Center.

### NCAA ELIGIBILITY



Students who earn at least a 2.0 GPA and meet the current slidingscale standard will be eligible for practice in the first term and athletically related financial aid the entire year, but not competition.

Freshmen who are academically successful in the first term will earn the ability to continue to practice for the remainder of the year.

Division III colleges and universities set their own admission standards. The NCAA does not set initial-eligibility requirements in Division III.

#### HIGH SCHOOL TIMELINE



- Start planning now! Take the right courses and earn the best grades possible.
- Find your high school's list of NCAA-approved core courses at eligibilitycenter.org/courselist
- Sign up for a free Profile Page at eligibilitycenter.org for information on NCAA requirements.

# TH REGISTER

- If you fall behind academically, ask your counselor for help finding approved courses you can take.
- Register for a Profile Page or Certification Account with the NCAA Eligibility Center at eligibilitycenter.org.
- Monitor your Eligibility Center account for next steps.
- At the end of the year, ask your counselor at each high school or program you attended to upload your official transcript to your NCAA Eligibility Center account.

# TH GRADE

- Check with your counselor to make sure you are on track to complete the required number of NCAA-approved courses and graduate on time with your class.
- Take the ACT or SAT and submit your scores to the NCAA Eligibility Center using code 9999.
- Ensure your sports participation information is correct in your Eligibility Center account.
- At the end of the year, ask your counselor at each high school or program you attended to upload your official transcript to your NCAA Eligibility Center account.

# 12<sub>TH</sub>



- Complete your final NCAA-approved core courses as you prepare for graduation.
- Take the ACT or SAT again, if necessary, and submit your scores to the NCAA Eligibility Center using code 9999.
- Request your final amateurism certification beginning April 1 (fall enrollees) or Oct. 1 (winter/spring enrollees) in your NCAA Eligibility Center account at eligibilitycenter.org.
- After you graduate, ask your counselor to upload your final official transcript with proof of graduation to your NCAA Eligibility Center account.
- Reminder: Only students on an NCAA
   Division I or II school's institutional request
   list will receive a certification.

# ATTENDANCE MATTERS!

- Good attendance is the first step to improving your grades!
- Valid reasons to miss school:
  - Fever
  - Vomiting
  - A diagnosed mental or physical illness
  - Family emergencies
- Reasons that DON'T require missing school:
  - Too tired- create better bedtime routines, make sure you're getting enough sleep
  - Someone is bothering or bullying you-instead of missing school, speak to your teacher, counselor, social worker, etc. in the building that can help! Don't try to ignore it and hope it goes away.
  - Mild aches or pains- can be common in the morning and are often easily fixed. You may need to eat breakfast or give your body time to wake up.
  - Vacations- take family vacations during summer break, it's not worth it to miss so many days in a row!
