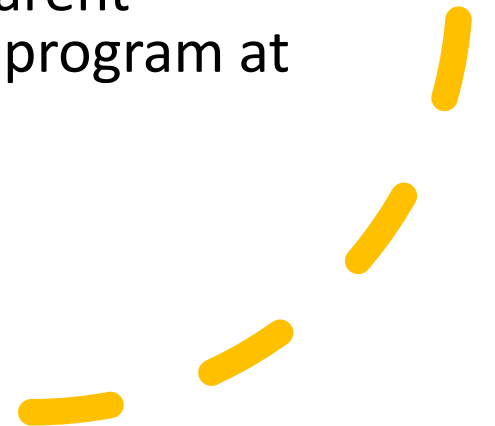
Public Statement

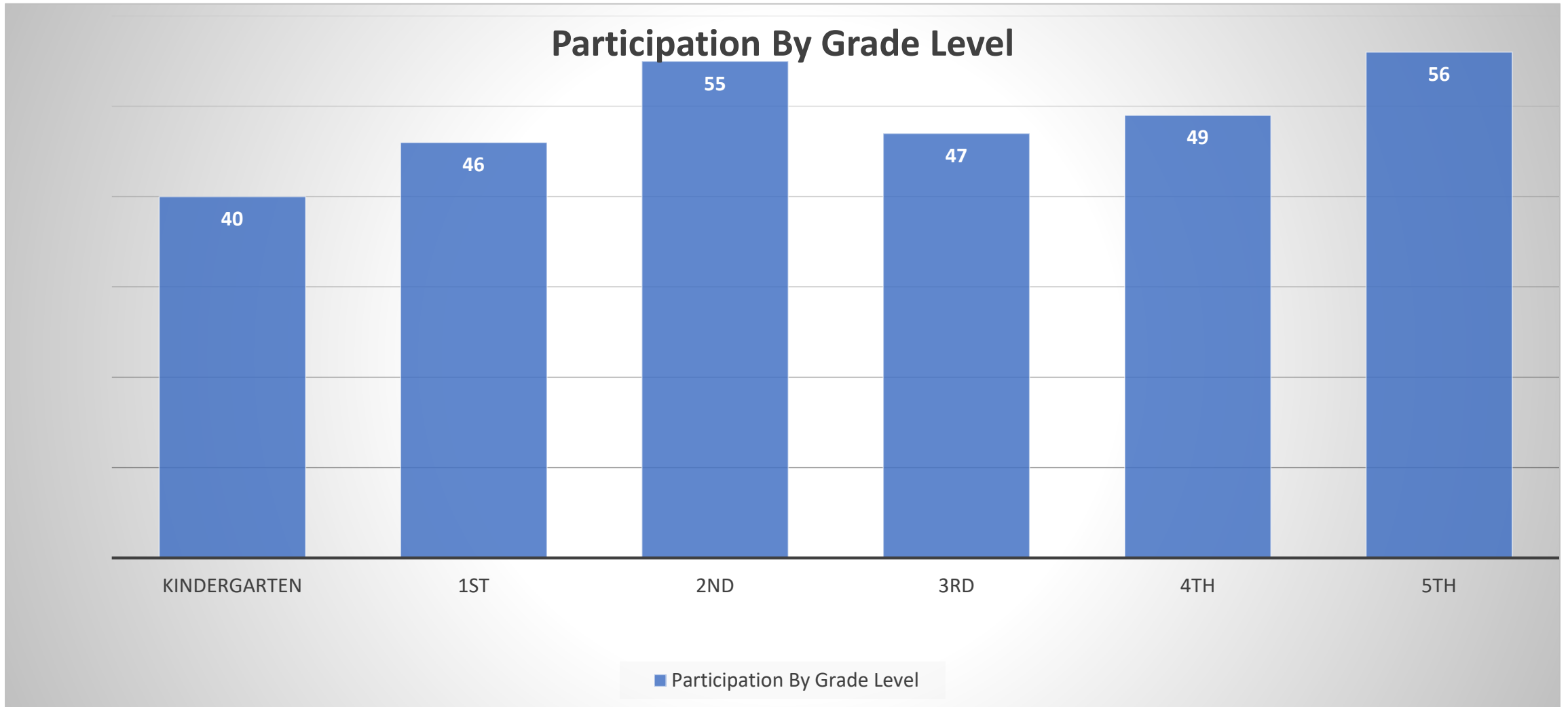

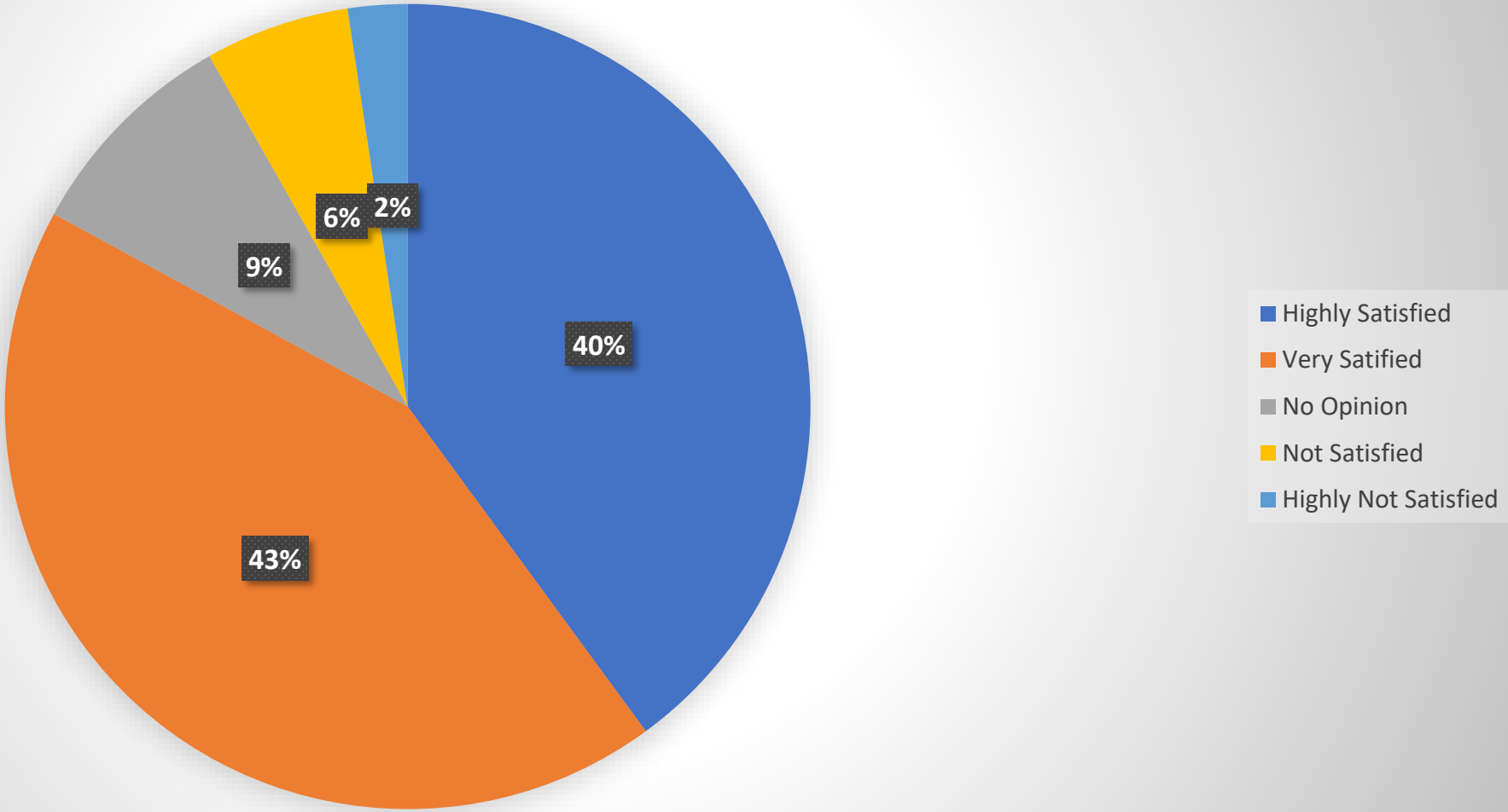

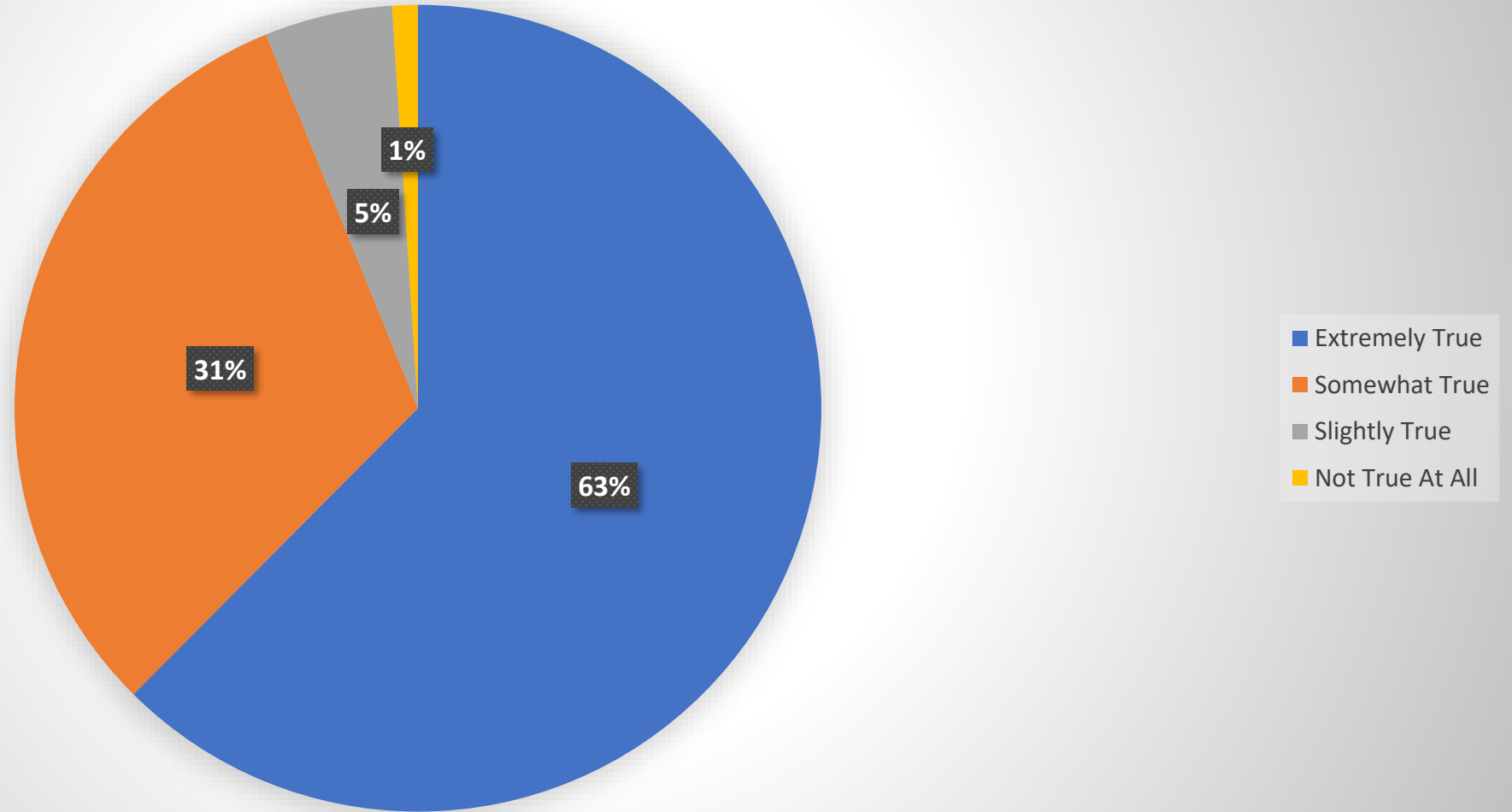

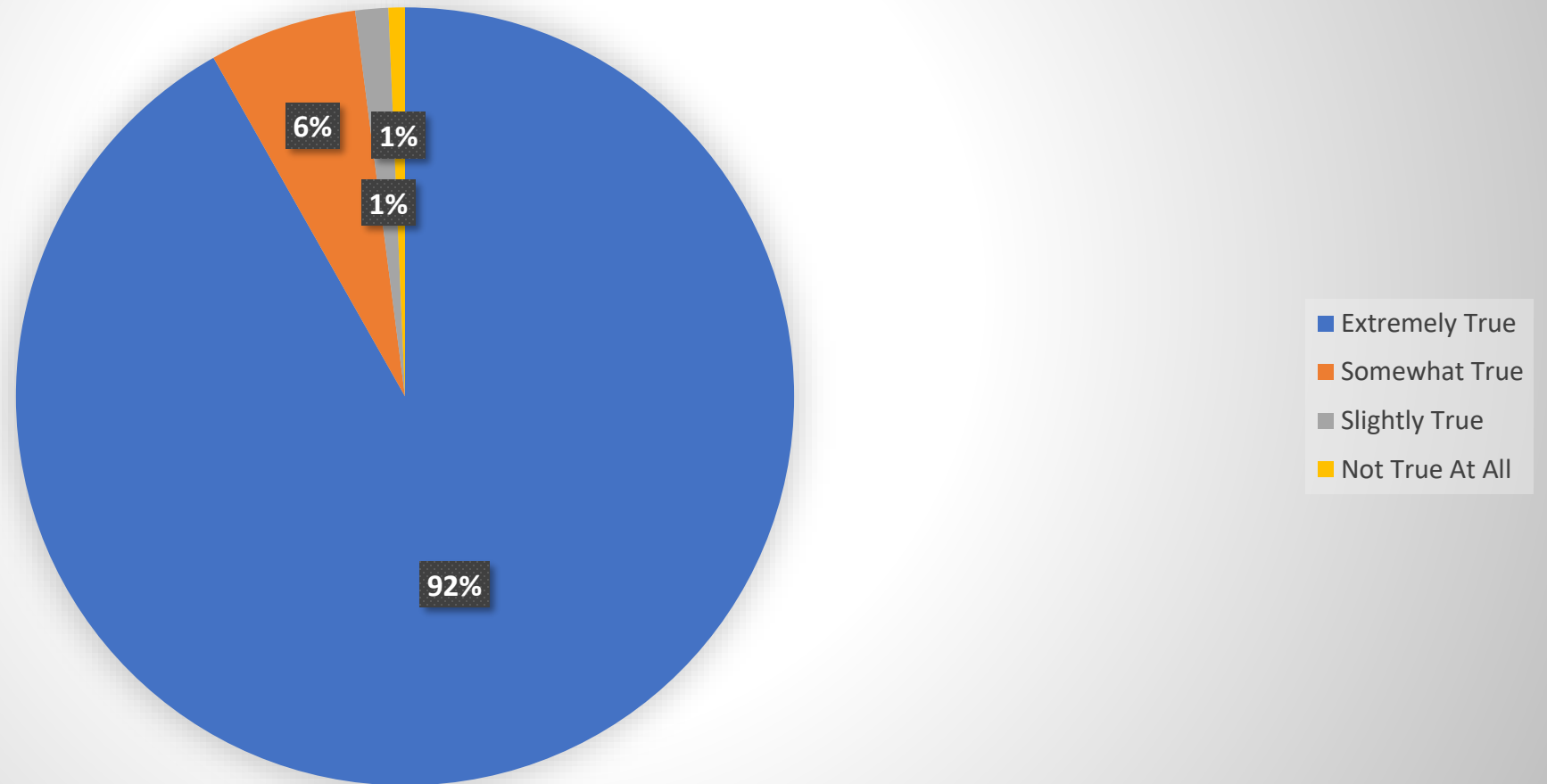
Rate you and your child's remote learning experience from the teachers of NES (not including the recorded lessons during the month of August)



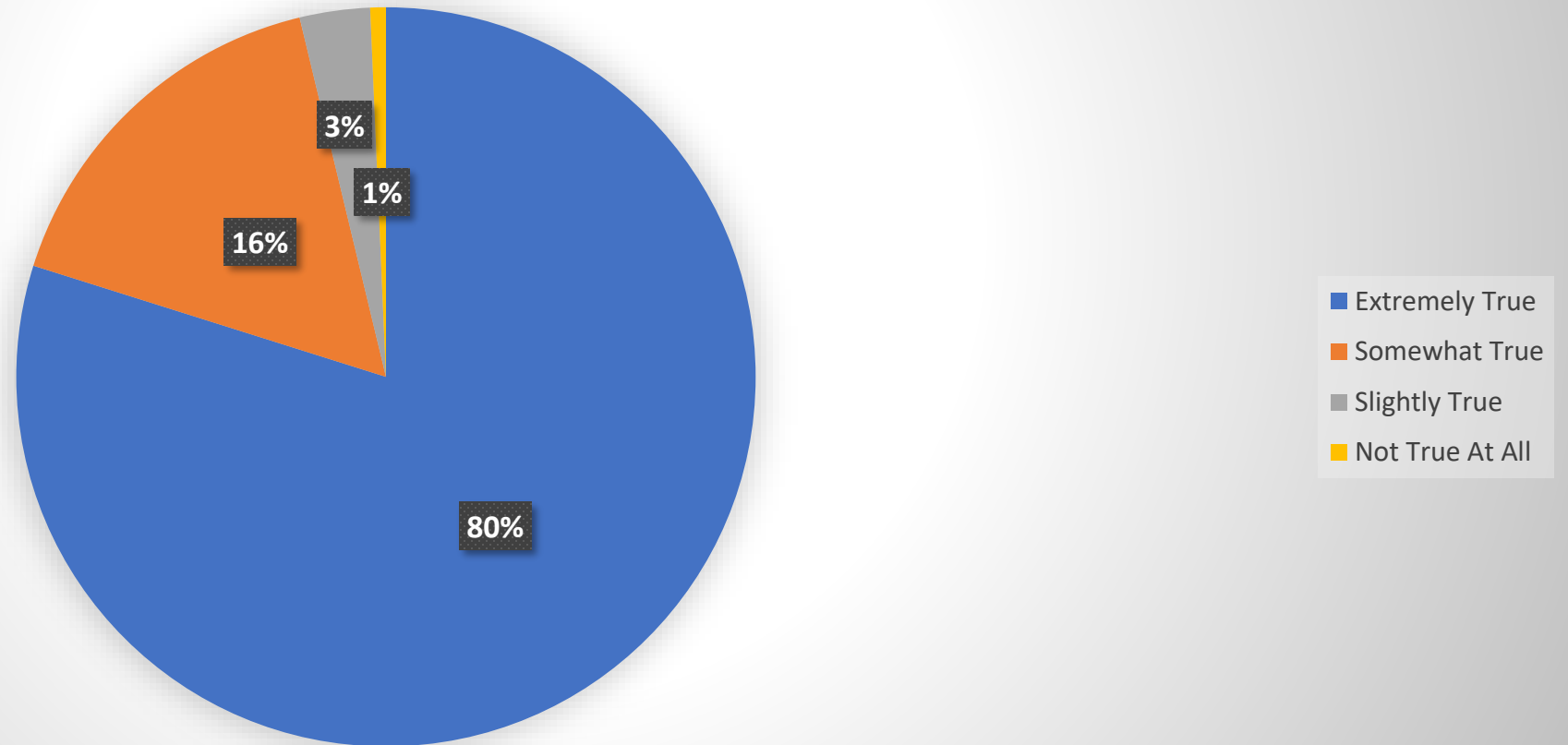
Please respond to the following statement: My child's teacher has been able to engage my child during remote learning.



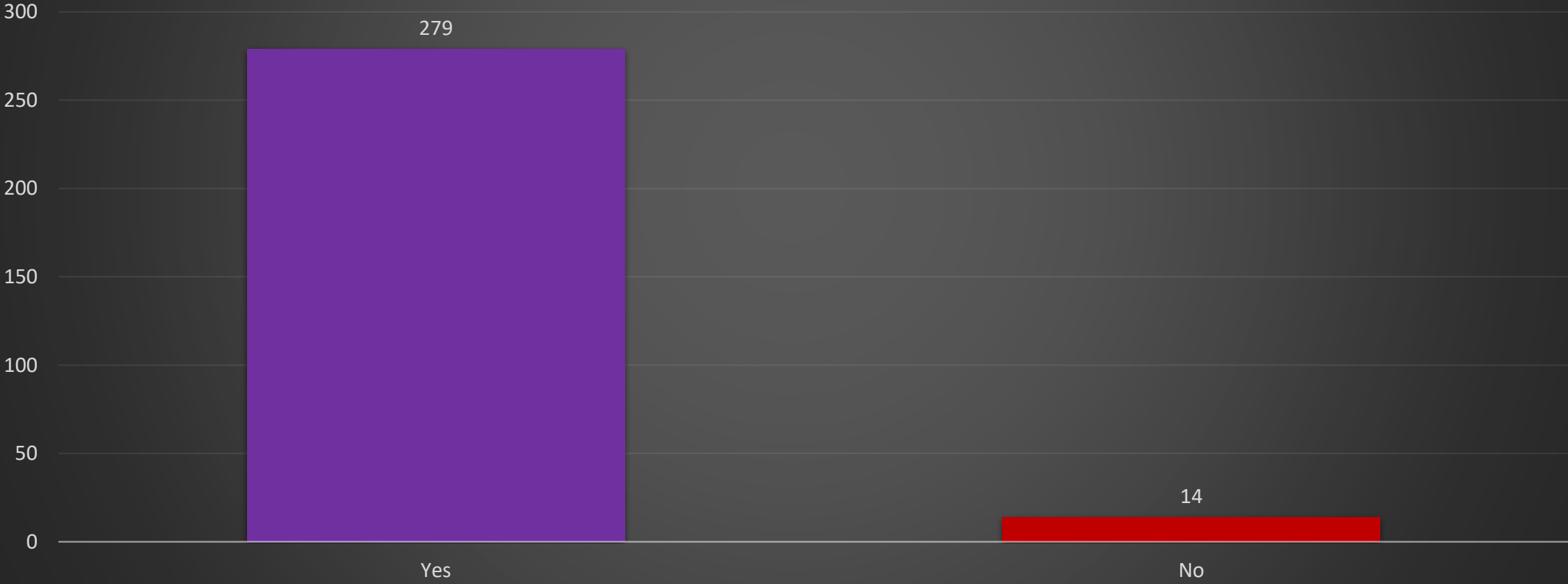
Please respond to the following statement: My child's teacher has been available when needed and has responded to questions in a timely manner.



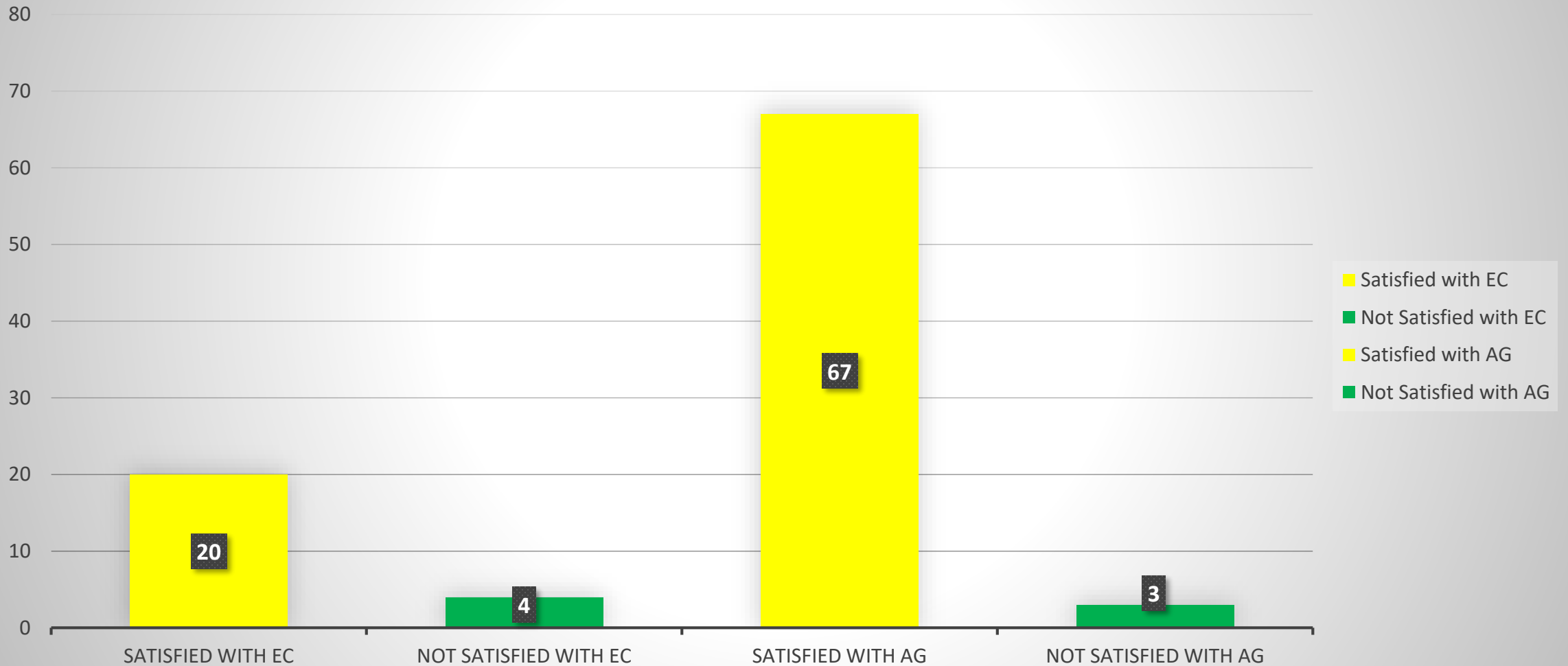
