2023-24 Cheat sheet for Community Dress Standards and One Card Western Guilford High School Community Dress Standards Expectations:

Students are expected to dress appropriately for the school learning environment. Clean, neat, appropriately sized, comfortable clothing, which allows students to participate in all events of school without undue concern, will be most appropriate. Consideration will be made for those students who, because of sincerely held religious beliefs, cultural heritage, or medical reasons, request a waiver of a guideline for dress or appearance. Please reference the following guidelines bulleted below

- Clothing must be age appropriate, cannot be distracting, revealing, indecent, or vulgar. Skirts and shorts should be worn without holes. Undergarments should not be visible at any time.
- Clothing will not be allowed which promotes alcoholic beverages, tobacco, the use of controlled substances, depicts
 violence, is of a sexual nature, is racially or culturally offensive, demeaning or degrading to a particular group or
 individual, or is disruptive in nature.

	Acceptable:	Prohibited: (includes but are not limited to)
Tops/ Dresses	 Shirts/dresses/jackets collared shirts. T-shirts, hooded, long and short sleeve and crewneck sweatshirts with school appropriate messaging. Tops must have a fitted arm opening. All tops must always cover the waistband of the bottom garment and the midriff. Undergarments always covered. 	 Shirts/apparel with offensive slogans or pictures (drugs, alcohol, guns, weapons, gangs, profanity, etc.). Tops with sheer or of mesh material as to the reveal the body or undergarments. Tube tops, spaghetti strap, strapless, muscle shirts, tank tops, cut-off shirts.
Bottoms	 All pants bottoms must be worn and fitted at the waist without holes or tears above the mid-thigh. Shorts, skirts, and dresses hemlines must be free of holes, rips, or tears and be an acceptable length (+/- 2" to at least fingertip length). Shorts, Skirts, Dresses hemlines must meet acceptable length (hemlines must fall +/- 2" to at least fingertip length-front, back, & side). 	 Holes or shredded areas at or above the midthigh that exposes skin or underwear. Slits in dresses and/or skirts must not extend higher than +/- 2" fingertip length.

Headgear, Footwear, & Other Items	 Dress pants, khaki pants, jeans, yoga pant, leggings and athletic style warm-ups or sweatpants. Undergarments should not be visible at any time. All students must wear shoes (flip-flops, slides, crocs, sneakers, etc.) Jewelry or body piercings are allowed with the exception of those that pose a health or safety risk. Facemasks, like those associated with the Covid-19 Pandemic, that only cover the nose and mouth are permitted and may be worn at the discretion of the student. 	 Bedroom slippers/shoes. Sleepwear is not permitted. Headgear (inside of the school) which includes but is not limited to hats, caps, earmuffs, bandanas, hoods, sweatbands, ski masks, or sunglasses may not be worn. Earbuds, Air pods, headphones, etc. are not to be used in classrooms. Any accessories or attire that has the potential to be used as a weapon is prohibited.
One Card	 The scanners will be placed at the entrances of the school building. ALL students are expected to enter through the entrances with one card stations and scanners. The One Card will be worn on a lanyard ground the peak of each student. 	Q: What if I don't have my One Card? A: You will be directed to the next steps by the staff scanning One Cards. Q: What if I break my lanyard? A: There is a fee to replace the lanyard Q: What if I lose my One Card? A: There is a fee of \$5 to replace the One Card Q: What if I am late for school? A: You will scan your One Card at the attendance desk.

The community dress standards apply to all students on campus at WGHS including exam days, field trips, and students attending Weaver. School-wide spirit days will be scheduled and announced throughout the year.
