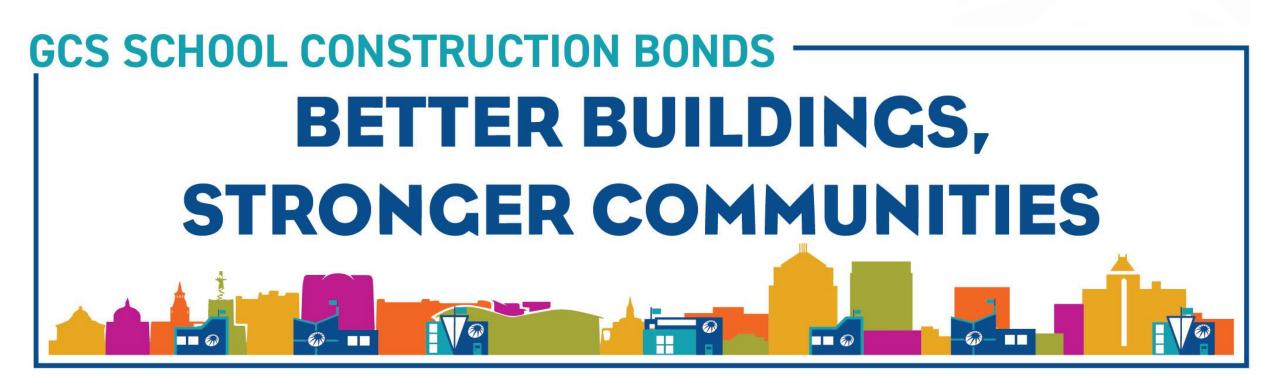

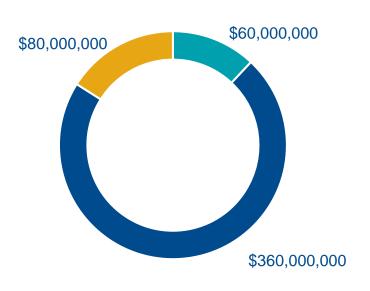

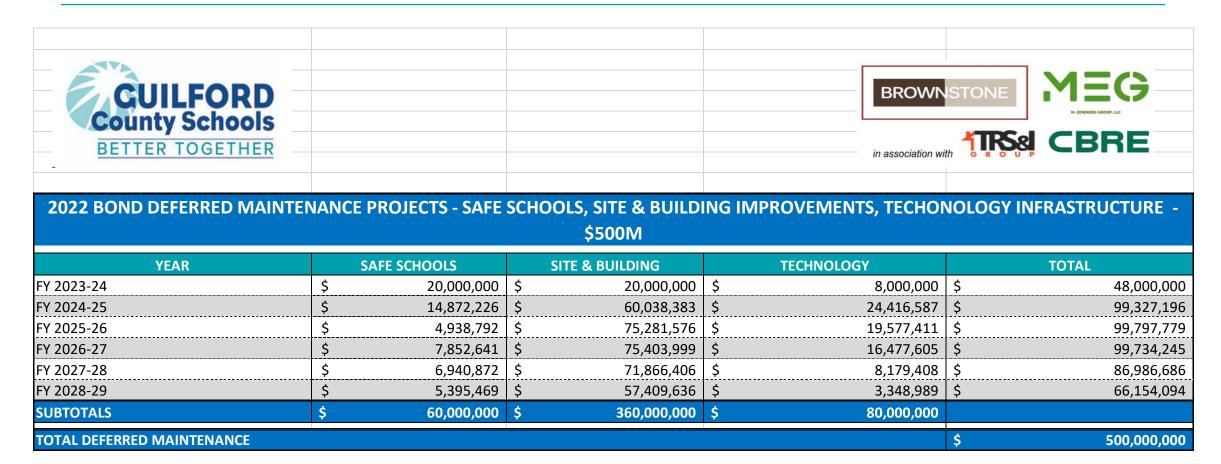

### **Supply Chain Challenges**

- Longer lead times leading to longer construction durations and higher costs
- Uncertainty of material and equipment availability
- Manufacturers not honoring fixed price contracts
