Other Required Materials

In addition to an instrument, your child will require the following items for my class:

- Rosin- this is a sticky substance that we rub on the hair of the bow to help produce sound.
- A Soft Cloth- this will be used to wipe down instruments after each class/practice session. A laundered cotton wash cloth will work fine.
- A Method Book- Essential Elements for Strings- Book 1 (with EEi) we will use this in class, and students should practice from this book at home. You will need the book that is specifically for your instrument.
- An Extra Full Set of Strings: (The brand should be D'addario or a brand of comparable quality) Strings should last for a good amount of time, but as we all know, accidents happen. I am happy to put the strings on your child's instrument if one becomes damaged or broken.
- A Rock Stop (Cello/Bass only) this is placed on the floor and is used to hold the instrument in place as your child plays.
- Shoulder Rest (Violin/Viola only) (Kun, Everest- or other similar style) this is used to make playing violin/viola more comfortable and ensures the proper position of the instrument as your child learns to play.
- □ **Metronome** This is a small electronic device that plays pitches for tuning and keeps a steady beat. If your child has a smartphone, there are a number of free apps available.
- Tuner- I HIGHLY recommend buying the Snark Super Tight ST-2 tuner. They usually run about 15 dollars.
- □ **A 1 inch, three-ring binder** and a **pencil** for music and note taking.
