"Civilization"

A civilization is <u>a society with cities, a</u> <u>central government, workers with</u> <u>specialized jobs, social classes, religion,</u> <u>writing, art, and architecture</u>.

 Geography is how people connect with the <u>land</u> they live on.

• **Different types** of land create different types of lifestyles.


• The location in which you live, including the weather, the city, your street name, is all a part of your geography.


- Religion is how we <u>believe</u> about the things we can't see or explain.

- Every group has politics (Friends, teams, schools, countries)





• Economics is how we get the things we need and want.


