- Can you name the five major religions?



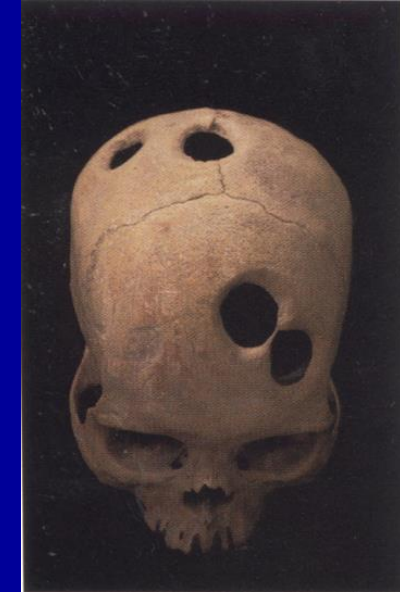


# A - Achievements

- Every group has politics (Friends, teams, schools, countries)

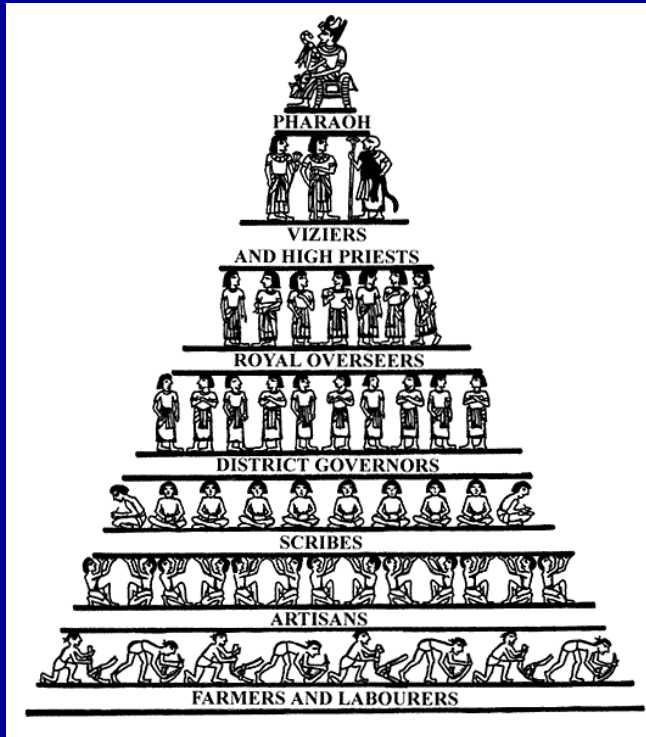


# E - Economics

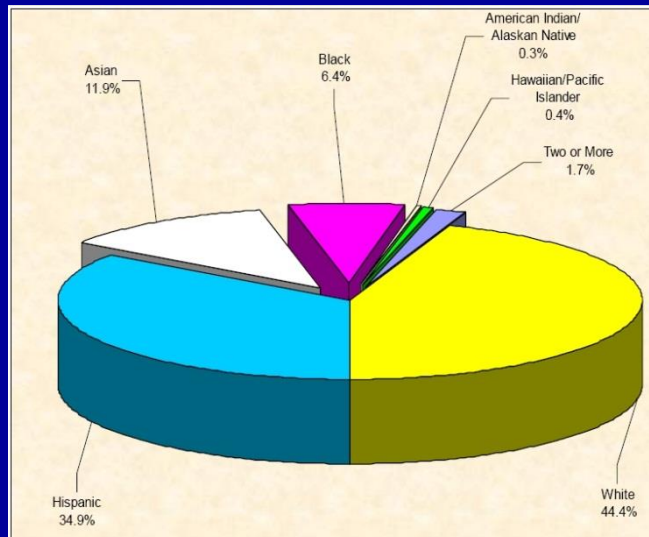
- Economics is how we get the things we need and want.

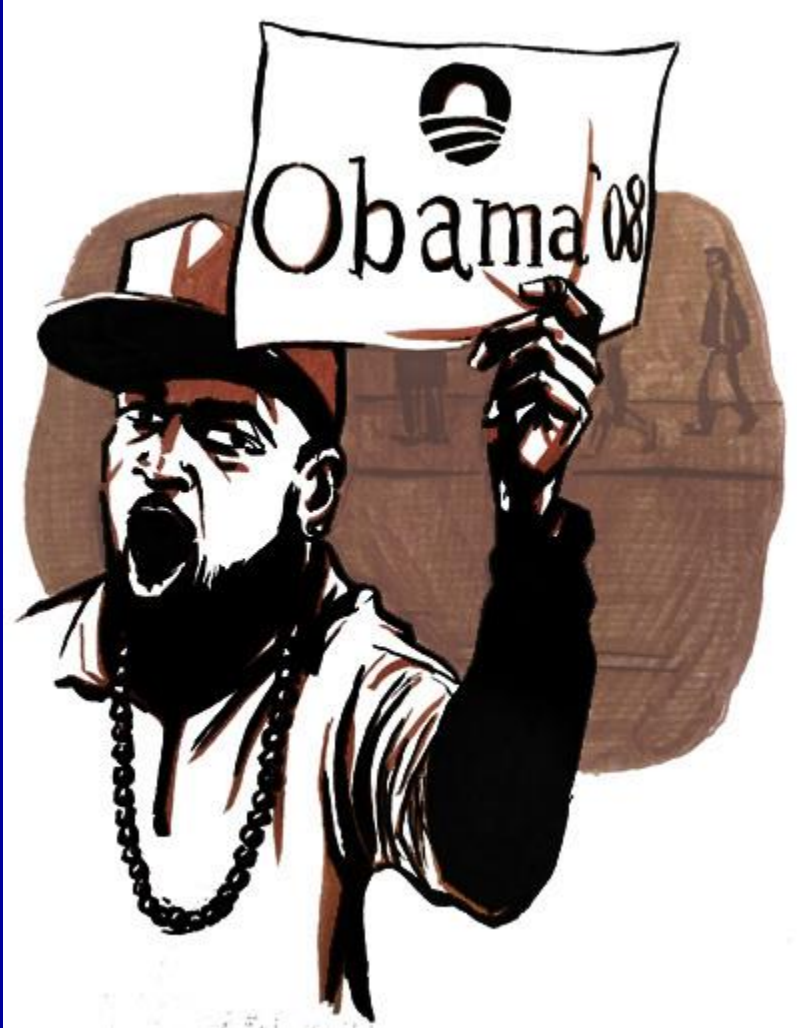

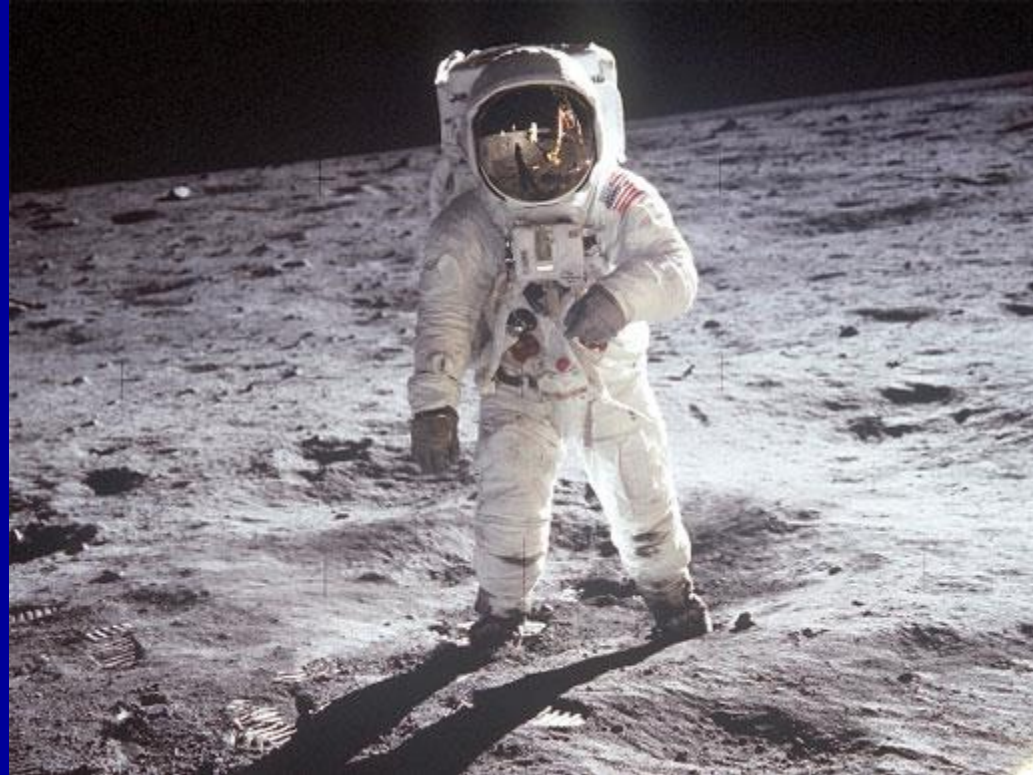
