

SOUTHEAST GUILFORD HUNTER SAFETY TEAM COMPLIANCE, CODE OF CONDUCT AND ETHICS

The purpose of this document is to establish the basis upon which the Southeast Guilford FFA Hunter Safety Team will be conducted and administered. It is also the intent of this document to clearly describe the responsibilities and general obligations of all participants, range safety officers (RSO), parents, spectators and coaches, regarding the subject of compliance, code of conduct and ethics. Cooperation with the ten listed items within this document will help ensure a good learning environment and project a positive role within the SE Guilford FFA Hunter Safety Team Program.

1. I agree to comply with all instructions, policies, and manuals, as set forth within the hunter safety program, to ensure uniform instruction to all students of the FFA Hunter Education Program.
2. As a member of the Team the use of alcoholic beverages, illegal substances or misuse of legal drugs are prohibited and inconsistent with the purpose of the SE Guilford FFA Hunter Safety Program and the character of its members.
3. Participants will wear team apparel for the entirety of an event, including competition, community service or sponsorship events. Participant not wearing team apparel will be replaced for the event(s) they are scheduled. This denotes unity, team spirit and promotes our sponsors, which have enabled us to participate in such events.
4. Profane, obscene, racial, ethnic, cultural or demeaning statements, gestures or materials are prohibited and will not be used in any portion of the FFA Hunter Safety Program. This includes any and all social media and or electric media used for the above stated purpose. You are representing SE Guilford High and Middle schools, Guilford County Schools, SE Guilford FFA and our sponsors every time we are assembled.
5. Open criticism of participants, RSOs or coaches and/or heated disagreements are prohibited in front of participants. Disagreements between coaches and others will be resolved in a professional and courteous manner, in private with a minimum of 2 coaches present.
6. Eating and the use of tobacco products are prohibited during Hunter Education Program training activities. These activities are permissible during breaks, outside the training areas.
7. The use of firearms will be consistent with range rules. While being transported to and from vehicles or range stations, all firearms must be kept in a case or sock and unloaded.
8. Ammunition and broad head arrowheads are prohibited in cases at ALL times. This includes practice, competition and class.
9. The use of any facility is a privilege; make every effort to do the right thing even when no one is looking. Leave all property associated with classrooms, practice ranges and competition ranges cleaner than when you arrived.
10. Participants must comply with the NCWRC rules and SE FFA Hunter Safety Team Guidelines and requirements.
