Our current senior class boasts 54 members en route to Diploma status, 60 juniors engaged full time, and over 100 additional students enrolled in 1 or more IB courses.

A SUMMARY OF THE IB PROGRAM AT GRIMSLEY HIGH SCHOOL

How do I earn an IB Diploma?

- Earn 24 IB Diploma Points by...
 - Participating in and completing internal/external assessments (i.e. exams) for 6 IB courses
 - Completing a Theory of Knowledge (TOK) course and assessment
 - Writing an original Extended Essay (the EE)
 - Completing a Creativity, Activity, and Service (CAS) Portfolio

What do I need to know about the 6 IB Courses?

- 3 must be Higher Level (HL) courses (No more than 4)—taken over 2 years
- 3 can be Standard Level (SL) courses (No fewer than 2)—taken over 1-2 years
- Each class comes from a different IB subject area (English, Foreign Language, Social Studies, Science, Math, and the Arts)

What is Theory of Knowledge (TOK)?

- A course to develop students' critical thinking
- Students will complete a TOK Presentation
- Students will also complete TOK Essay on one of six IB prescribed titles
- Students will work on CAS and their Extended Essay in TOK

What is the Extended Essay (EE)?

- An in-depth independent research of a specific topic chosen by the student
- Completed with consultation with a supervisor (Usually a classroom teacher)
- Maximum of 4000 words
- Roughly 40 hours of research, writing, and reflection over 2 years
- Much of this work will be accomplished in second semester of TOK

What is the Creativity, Activity, and Service (CAS) Portfolio?

- Begins junior year and completed over 2 years. Students learn outside the classroom through...
 - Creativity—encourages students to engage and think critically about the arts
 - Activity—seeks to develop a healthy lifestyle through physical activity
 - Service—providing service to the community as a vehicle for new learning
- Includes a reflective log throughout the CAS experience with evidence of learning outcomes
- Students will receive instruction and class time to document and reflect on CAS in TOK

POTENTIAL PRE-IB and IB SCHEDULE PATHWAY FOR EACH YEAR:

FRESHMEN Pre-IB Students: Honors Civics, AP US Government, Honors English I, Honors Math II or III, World Language (level 1 or higher), Honors Biology, Health and PE, and an elective.

SOPHOMORE Pre-IB Students: *Honors Economics & Personal Finance, AP European History, Honors English II, Honors Math III/AP Stats/AP Pre-Calculus, World Language (level 2 or higher), Honors Chemistry, and an elective. *EPF can be taken online the summer before or after 10th grade year.

<u>JUNIOR IB STUDENTS</u>: IB Theory of Knowledge, IB English SL, AP US History, Math (AP Pre-Calc, AP Stats, IB Math, or AP Calculus) World Language (level 3, 4, or IB), IB Science (IB Biology, IB Environmental, IB Chemistry, or IB Physics), Possible Elective

SENIOR IB STUDENTS: IB 20th Century World History, IB English HL, IB Science (Unless already tested in the junior year), Math (IB or AP Calculus—Must take a math course all four years) IB World Language (Unless already tested in the junior year), Honors Economics and Personal Finance.

HONORS, AP, IB Courses offered:

Some courses are not offered every year since offerings require a minimum enrollment. This list is not exhaustive and is subject to change depending on course registration numbers.
