






GCS recommends that all High School students begin their day at 9:00 am by logging into their first block/period Canvas course. Monday through Thursday students will engage in live teaching sessions through Canvas. Friday there will be pre-recorded content.

Students will have daily assignments to complete each day in each class.

Students will be provided at least 5 minutes between each live session.

Teachers will provide scheduled small group instruction starting at 2pm at least once a week and starting at 2:30pm on Fridays by appointment.

*All small sessions will end after 10 minutes if there are no participants.

Advanced Placement (AP) classes will continue to use College Board resources as directed by their teachers.

Teachers will have morning and afternoon time set aside for communication during planning and from 2pm until 3pm.



Return to School Guidelines


GCS' plan to reopen schools depends on whether public health indicators regarding community spread are trending in the right direction. The school board approved metrics that were developed in partnership with the Guilford County Public Health Department.

No one measure supersedes another, and the overall trend lines are more important than specific data points, according to public health officials.

The metrics include:

- the number of new cases daily per 100,000 persons in Guilford County
- the number of new cases within the last 14 days per 100,000 persons in Guilford County
- the daily positivity rate in Guilford County as compared to the total number of tests taken
- compliance with public health measures in schools by students and staff.
- The secondary indicators include a downward, 14-day trend in hospitalization rates for COVID-19 in Guilford County and the community's intensive care unit capacity. (October 2 - October 16)

The goal of reopening is to serve the maximum number of students possible for the greatest amount of time possible while also keeping students and staff healthy and safe. Mitigation factors are critical: public health officials continue to remind us it is vital to wear face coverings, maintain social distance, and practice good hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette - not only at school or work but at home and in the community as well.



Public Health Indicators for School Re-Entry Determined in Conjunction with the Guilford County Public Health Department

Primary Indicators for School Re-Entry

- 1. Case Incidence (the number of new cases during a period-of-time)
- Number of new cases daily per 100,000 persons in Guilford County (Harvard)
- Number of new cases within the last 14 days per 100,000 persons in Guilford County (CDC)
- 2. Positivity Rate (percentage of positive tests to the total number of tests)
- Daily positivity rate in Guilford County is under 5% and trend has been sustained for 14 consecutive days
- 3. Ability to Implement Mitigation Strategies
- Consistent and correct use of masks
- · Social distancing to the largest extent possible
- · Hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette
- Cleaning and disinfection
- Contact tracing in collaboration with local health departments

Secondary Indicators for School Re-Entry

Hospital Capacity

- Downward, 14-day trend in hospitalization rates in Guilford County for COVID-19
- 2. Intensive care unit capacity in the community








Guilford County Schools reentry timeline:

- Oct. 20: Confirmed Return
 - Pre-K-2nd Grade
- Oct. 30: School leaders expect to make an announcement on whether to go forward with school reentry for the next group of students.
- Nov. 4 or 5: Possible Return
 - Grades 3 through 5
 - Students at the district's four public separate schools for students with special needs
 - High school seniors who must complete requirements for the Certified Nurse Assistant credential prior to graduation in the spring

The return would depend on the findings of district's review of the COVID-19 metrics.

October 13 GCS Board ofEd Updates cont.

 Nov. 5: Expected announcement on whether to go forward with school reentry for the next group of students.

Nov. 12: Possible Return

- Middle school students could return on a staggered,
 A/B schedule for two days of in-person learning and three days of remote learning.
- High School students who are homeless, in foster care, in the first two years of English language acquisition or who have disabilities and are served in a self-contained classroom could return four days per week, with remote learning on Wednesdays.

CURRENT PLAN: Continue the schedule we have been following


- Nov. 30-Dec. 4: All students and staff work and learn remotely as a temporary precaution aimed at limiting possible COVID-19 spread following the Thanksgiving holiday.
- Jan. 20: Possible Return. High school students could return on a A/B schedule, depending on the findings of a review of the COVID-19 metrics.




- Here's a quick update on the delivery status regarding the 79,000 devices we ordered in August:
- Apple iPad cases. The iPads are here (in district). However, we are waiting on the cases, which are estimated to arrive by the first week of November.
- MacAir laptops have been shipped to a provider where they will be labeled and have asset tags applied. The estimated shipment of the laptops to GCS is targeted for the last week of October.
- Teacher Thinkpad L15 devices will arrive in GCS by mid-October from the Raleigh warehouse. Qty: 4,500
- 52,300 Student Chromebooks Due to issues with supply/demand, there will be a staged delivery of devices, beginning with the county government purchase order of 30,557 devices in August. While delivery estimates are subject to change, currently we are expecting deliveries as follows: 8,000 will ship in October; 15,000 will ship in November; 21,000 will ship in December; and 8,000 will ship in January (HIGH SCHOOL DEVICES)


Athletic Update




- October 16, end of quarter!

Attendance:


- Attendance is taken through the Teams presentation tool.
