<u>PERFORMANCE COMPOSITE</u>: James B. Dudley High School will increase the overall school performance composite for

- o Math 1 from 19.5% to 21.6% as measured by the state accountability model.
- o Math 3 from 22.3% to 27.3% as measured by the state accountability model.
- o English 2 from 36.9% to 41.9% as measured by the state accountability model.
- o Biology from 27.7% to 32.7% as measured by the state accountability model. (Data and Evaluation 38, Problem Solving 26, A4.01)

<u>ATTENDANCE</u>: By James B. Dudley High School will reduce the number of chronically absent students by 30% from 49.3% to 34.51%. (Communication 21, Problem Solving 26, A4.01, A4.06)

The Draft School Improvement Plan Goals were voted on and approved by the SBLT/Title I Team.

ANNOUNCEMENTS/KUDOS/CONCERNS

There was a question regarding Curriculum Matters. Ms. Brasher reported that Curriculum Matters is back. Dr. Eaddy Busch and Mrs. Oates are working on the Professional Development Calendar. A survey will be provided for teachers to get ideas and interest for Curriculum Matters Professional Development Meetings.

Mrs. Timmons McLaughlin shared that the Dudley High School Alumni Class of 1972 – 50th Reunion Class raised 35,000 for student scholarships.

15 Dudley Alumni Classes raised a total of \$78,000 during Dudley Alumni Weekend in July 2022.

The Dudley Alumni Association presented 21 scholarships in June 2022 to graduating seniors in the Dudley High School Class of 2022.

Ms. Brenda James, Dudley Alumni Association Representative stated that the National Dudley High School Alumni Association voted in July 2022 to plan and implement the celebration of the 100th Year of Dudley High School in 2029.

Mrs. Timmons McLaughlin and Mrs. G. Robinson shared that the Elevation Church has partnered with Dudley High School for teacher support and student success. The Elevation Church has provided snacks, hair products, T-shirts, bookbags, and school supplies. The Elevation Church has also provided a \$10,000 donation to Dudley High School.
