- b. It is the needs-based assessment which informs what the school needs and how the money will be used.

 - ii. Building the Capacity/Infrastructure for Implementation=76%
 - iii. Communication and Collaboration=83%
 - iv. Data-Based Problem-Solving=71%
 - 1. Item# 24-problem analysis across all tiers -why students are not meeting expectations
 - a. Simkins has an effective data tracking system
 - b. The implementation is not necessarily consistent across the school
 - c. Need to develop SEL support
 - 5 weeks of WOW for adults was attended by Toman

 - v. We would love to have parent volunteers to help with monitoring students during recess

 - i. We kicked off the fundraiser right before we were out of school

 - 1. Wait until the systems are in place in classrooms

 - 4. Have a representative at Open House and Parent Nights to collect memberships
 - 5. Have a certificate that shows you have joined PTA posted by your door
 - 6. Provide incentives for teachers to join
 - iii. PTA support
 - **1.** Have a parent support at each grade level to make copies, etc.
 - a. Provide a timeframe for parent volunteers
 - **b.** We have a sign-up excel spreadsheet for teachers to ask for help
 - i. A PTA member works with Volunteer Coordinator to collect day and times and match volunteer with teacher
 - 2. Providing treats for car rider
 - iv. Ideas:
 - 1. Develop Simkins' Grandparents initiative
 - 2. Provide 2 parents that focus on a grade level
 - 3. Reduce fundraisers that require students to sell items
 - a. Families might be able to donate money instead-Time for Change
 - v. Ask parents to go through the GCS criminal background check regularly
