- e. Required Parent involvement money is \$3,367.94.
 - i. Any supplies and materials needed for these are taken out of this fund.
- f. Instructional Leadership Team attended New Leaders meeting
 - i. MTSS was the focus of the New Leaders meeting.
 - ii. Mrs. Jordan reviewed the three Tiers of support in academics, behavior, and social/emotional areas.
 - iii. ILT, IST, IEP-three levels of support
 - iv. Mrs. Jordan shared the MTSS survey that was filled out in the New Leaders meeting.
 - v. 41 items on the survey
 - vi. We scored 3's on each question of the survey.
 - vii. Mrs. Jordan shared the FAM-S Survey Summary which indicated that we scored "optimizing" in all areas.
 - viii. The state wants all schools to be at "optimizing" by 2020.
 - ix. It is important to teach new staff members how to track data and about our systems we have put in place.
 - x. The purpose of MTSS is to have multi-tiered systems in place that address academic, behavior, and social-emotional needs of the students. If systems are in place and done with fidelity, then a school should run smoothly and build efficacy.
