<u>Course Description and Goals | Spanish II:</u> This course is designed to create a continuing interest in the Spanish language and give students a good foundation in the <u>second</u> required Spanish course for college admission. Students will become proficient in using vocabulary and grammar and various verb conjugations.

<u>In Spanish II</u> the goal is to reach the Novice High-Intermediate level proficiency. You will have enough Spanish to participate in straightforward conversations and to understand readings and audio related to daily-living themes like: personal identity, school and community, cultural identity, family, healthful living, food, culture, and our social lives. Building on what you learned in Spanish I, your sentences will be a little more complex and you will have more to say on each topic. Also, instead of memorized answers ("I am fine, thank you"), you will be able to create answers, saying what you really want to say ("Well, I have a headache"). Participation in this course will require students to communicate by **listening**, **speaking**, **reading**, **and writing in the target language**. To develop your proficiency, you will need to practice in class and outside of class. You are expected to reflect on your progress and mastery.

<u>Tarea y "Prueba del día" (20%):</u> I strongly believe that meaningful homework activities are a vital part of mastering content. Reading the assigned material and completing homework will be essential to success in this class. Students who come to class ill prepared cannot take full advantage of class activities. First thing each class period, we will go over the homework. Students are responsible for correcting any errors. At times, I will check for completion, other times I will collect homework for a grade. Each day's assignment will be written on the board and posted on Canvas. In addition, there will be a <u>"Prueba del día"</u> EVERYDAY. This will either be collected at the end of class or to be done on the day of class on Canvas. No late homework will be accepted.

<u>Actividades de escuchar y hablar (15%):</u> Include formal and informal assessments of listening and speaking activities.

<u>Participación y trabajo de clase (20%):</u> Students are expected to complete all assignments and come to class prepared to <u>actively</u> participate and <u>speak</u> in the Spanish language. All students need to fully participate in class activities and discussions. Each day's activities are designed with a specific purpose and contribute to students' overall success.

<u>Examenes/pruebas/proyectos (45%):</u> Are given on a regular basis. Quizzes may cover a chapter or a specific theme/topic (such as a vocabulary or map quiz), while tests, both written and oral; will cover completed units and conversations in Spanish. In addition, other major projects will be assigned at different points throughout the semester. Students will be given scoring rubrics and grading expectations as projects are assigned.

<u>Absence Policy:</u> Each student has been given a copy of the Guilford County Attendance policy. If a student is absent it is his/her responsibility to find out what assignments have been missed and to then make arrangements to turn in all missed work within 3 days of returning to school. Work not made up during this time period will be given a zero. All assignments and lesson plans will be available in the classroom so that the student can find out what has been missed. It is the student's responsibility to turn in missed work and schedule a time to make up any quiz or test missed during an absence. Students will only be allowed to make up work for excused absences. Homework will be posted daily on class Canvas page.

<u>Tutorial Sessions:</u> Opportunities for reinforcement will be offered every *Tuesday and Thursday* from 4:15 to 5:00 p.m. and any other day *before or after school* when requested. Any student who fails a test or has below a "C" average in the class may be required to attend tutorial.

Sra. Schuck Dillon's TOP DIEZ STUDY TIPS and HOW TO BE SUCCESSFUL en la clase de español:

- 1) Speak Spanish in AND outside of class
- 2) Do *your* homework
- 3) STUDY EACH NIGHT for at least 20-30 minutes and memorize vocabulary
- 4) Be present and participate
- 5) Take advantage of tutoring
- 6) Use proper English when communicating in Spanish
- 7) Keep your communications limited to the words that you have been taught
- 8) Pay attention and follow the rules
- 9) Invest in a Spanish-English dictionary
- 10) Utilize APPROVED on-line resources such as the ¡SpanishDict! App, quizlet, studyspanish.com and conjuguemos.com

<u>During our daily activities and interaction, we will promote a learning environment by doing what is right, doing our best, and treating others the way we would like to be treated.</u>

It will therefore be important that we observe the following classroom expectations and procedures:

- 1. **BE RESPECTFUL!** You will be expected to always show respect to your fellow classmates, your teacher, and the items in the classroom at all times. Disrespect will not be tolerated.
- 2. **BE PREPARED and BE ON TIME!** Students will come to class with all required materials and <u>be ready</u> <u>to work</u> at the sound of the bell. <u>Please use restroom before or after class, not during.</u> Please limit movement and be aware of your voice level. Students are expected to work silently on the day's opening activity unless otherwise instructed. <u>NOTE:</u> Students will not be able to enter class after the tardy bell unless they have a pass from another teacher or Ms. Gurley.
- 3. **BE RESPONSIBILE!** I commit to doing my part as the teacher and expect that each of you will take individual responsibility for your behavior and learning.
- 4. **BE ATTENTIVE!** In this class, you must pay attention and listen carefully. Take good, thorough notes and keep your notebook organized. Please raise your hand to ask or answer a question as this constitutes respect for your peers. Do not speak while someone else is talking.
- 5. **NO CELL PHONES OR ELECTRONIC DEVICES**. Weaver Academy's electronic device policy will be *strictly* enforced. On the first day of class, you will be assigned a number. Each day when you enter the classroom, please place your phone <u>AND</u> ear buds in the corresponding numbered phone pocket of the wall hanger, located on the back wall.
- 6. NO FOOD OR DRINK is allowed in class.
- 7. **BEWARE!** *I will dismiss you, not the bell.* Everyone will be quiet during announcements. **The bathroom may be used <u>before or after class</u>, preferably <u>NOT</u> during class.
- 8. **INAPPROPRIATE BEHAVIOR:** I believe that all students are capable of learning and deserve the opportunity to learn. Creating a successful learning environment is a shared responsibility between teacher and student. Any behavior which inhibits teaching and impedes learning will not be accepted. **All rules and regulations listed in the GCS student handbook will be enforced in this class.**

<u>Consequences:</u> Upon breaking a rule, a student will be given a warning from the instructor. Some actions can immediately lead to an administrative referral. If the behavior were to continue following a warning, further consequences will follow; including parent contact, detention, and administrative referral.

Miscellaneous:

- **Be honest!** Follow the code of conduct and demonstrate academic integrity. Do your <u>own</u> work!! Your performance is to be your own, not a colleague's and not that of google translate or A!!
- Copying other's work and submitting it as your own <u>WILL NOT</u> be tolerated. Copying work of a fellow classmate will result in a "0" for <u>BOTH</u> parties.
- All papers are to be kept NEATLY and ORGANIZED in your Spanish notebook.
 DO NOT THROW AWAY ANY PAPERS.
- Use of electronic translating devices are <u>NOT</u> advised.
- Extra credit *will not* be offered.
- PLEASE DO NOT HESITATE TO COME SEE ME WITH ANY NEEDS OR CONCERNS. I want and am here to help you have a first-rate and enjoyable Spanish learning experience.
