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Dear Brown Summit Middle School Families:

As part of North Carolina Testing law (G.S. § 115C-174), your 6th – 8th grade child is required to take the End-of Grade (EOG) Tests. Students enrolled in NC Math 1 will take the End-of-Course (EOC) Test, and students enrolled in Math 2 will take a final exam. This letter provides important information about the **End-of-Grade and End-of-Course Tests**.

End of Year Testing Schedule

7 th Grade Math I EOC	Friday, May 31
8 th Grade Science EOG	Friday, May 31

All EOG/EOCs for all grade levels and subjects are administered in an online format.

Following the EOG Test administration, each family will receive an Individual Student Report (ISR) with each child's score. This report will display your child's reading, math, and/or science scores compared to other students in Guilford County and North Carolina.

Students should go to bed early, have a good breakfast and get to school on time each day for testing. We encourage students to arrive at 8am. Please remind students to:

- attempt each question or prompt on the test;
- refrain from causing distractions for other students during testing;
- not bring extra scratch paper, dictionaries, reference books, textbooks, cameras, thumb drives, cell phones, smartpens, smartwatches, electronic readers, music, thesauruses, cell phones, other electronic device;
- bring a novel or other non-textbook, such as a magazine, to read after they complete the test administration.

Electronic Device Policy During Testing

In preparation for testing each day, students are required to silence and put away all electronic devices into their lockers. This includes cell phones, smart watches, electronic readers, etc. If students are found to have any of these devices in their possession during testing, they will be confiscated and held until the next school day for parent pick up. Thank you for encouraging students to follow these expectations so that we can create the best testing environment for all students.
