

**Guilford County Schools  
Inclement Weather Procedures for State Testing**

<b>State Testing (EOG/EOC/NCFE)</b>	
If Guilford County Schools (GCS) is <b>delayed by 1 hour</b>	<b>The scheduled state test(s) can continue, but testing will occur on a delayed scheduled according to the school's delayed scheduled.</b>
If GCS is <b>delayed by 2 or more hours</b>	<b>The scheduled state test(s) will NOT BE ADMINISTERED THAT DAY.</b>
<b>If school is cancelled</b> in GCS	<b>The scheduled state test(s) will be CANCELLED.</b> If school is cancelled for 1 day, testing will resume on the next day school is back in session. If school is cancelled for 2 or more days, testing will resume on the second day school is back in session.
If GCS is <b>dismissed early</b>	Students should continue testing as long as possible. Principals must establish an ending time for test sessions that allows for return of test materials to the STC prior to early dismissal. Tests turned in to the test administrator prior to the established end of the test session will be considered valid, completed assessments. All other tests will become misadministrations and those students must retest with a different form of the test when they return.

<b>ACT Testing</b>	
If GCS is <b>delayed or cancelled.</b>	All decisions concerning the rescheduling of ACT tests are negotiated between ACT and the NCDPI. Schools are <b>NOT</b> to contact ACT concerning school closings or delays. The Office of Testing Administration will report to the NCDPI and directions will be communicated to the schools accordingly.
ACT Accommodations window	ACT accommodations are administered between the initial and makeup days of the regular ACT administration. Schools are to utilize every administration day available within the window and should not delay testing students until the end of the two-week window. ACT will not grant additional days for accommodations due to inclement weather.
